



Reduce the spread of infection in places for recreational and cultural activities

According to the temporary COVID-19 Act, businesses have a duty to prevent the spread of infection by operating in such a way that crowding of people is avoided and ensuring that people can keep a safe distance from each other from an epidemiological point of view.

If you run gym- or sports facilities, swimming pools, museums, art galleries, amusement parks, zoos, theme parks and similar facilities, you must:

- Limit the number of customers and other visitors to avoid spread of infection.
 - Calculate the maximum number of customers or visitors allowed to stay in an indoor facility or facility area.
 - Ensure that the maximum number is not exceeded, including for each delimited space.
 - Document in writing the maximum number and how this has been calculated, including for each delimited space.
 - Clearly allocate the maximum number for business premises and facility areas, including for each delimited space.
 - Arrange indoor business premises and outdoor areas and spaces in such a way as to avoid crowding of people and allow visitors to keep a safe distance from each other to avoid spread of infection.
 - Arrange entry and exit passages to indoor premises and outdoor areas and spaces in such a way as to avoid crowding of people.
 - Inform customers and visitors about how to avoid spread of infection.
 - Offer customers and visitors an opportunity to wash their hands with soap and water or offer hand sanitizer.
- Document in writing other infection control measures that the business has taken.
 - Follow up on the infection control measures.
 - Ensure that staff are adequately informed about hygiene measures to prevent spread of infection.
 - Stay informed about special recommendations from the Public Health Agency of Sweden and the regional epidemiologist.

Calculation of maximum number

- The maximum number for swimming facilities, gyms or sports facilities, museums or art galleries shall be calculated on the basis that each customer or visitor, within each delimited indoor space, must be able to dispose of at least 10 square metres of the available space. The maximum number for the total surface area of a facility may never exceed 500 persons.
- For amusement parks, zoos, theme parks or similar facilities, the maximum number should be calculated on the basis that each visitor within the facility area is able to dispose of at least 20 square meters of the available area.
- Amusement parks or similar attractions must take measures to avoid crowding of people.
